AN ACT

Relative to the furnishing of Liveries or Uniforms
by Employers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Any corporation, firm or person
2 requiring any person employed by him or it to
3 wear a livery, uniform or prescribed dress, or any
4 part of such dress, shall furnish the same to such
5 employee, free of charge; and if such prescribed
6 dress includes a suit of clothes or a cap or hat,
7 then not less than two suits of clothes and not
8 less than two hats or caps shall so be furnished in
9 each year.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall not apply to liveries
2 worn by private servants.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
