AN ACT

For the Better Protection of Employees working upon Iron Structures.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Whenever in the erection of an iron
- 2 frame building of three stories or more, as each story
- 3 is added a loose plank flooring shall be placed upon the
- 4 girder beams, so to make a reasonably close flooring
- 5 with not more than one inch between each plank, but
- 6 floorings will not be required only upon the last and next
- 7 to the last story as the building progresses in erection.
- 1 Section 2. In the construction of all iron bridges
- 2 good and sufficient plank stagings shall be used.

PROTECTION OF EMPLOYEES. [Feb. 1901.

- 1 Section 3. Any person violating this act shall be
- 2 punished by a fine not exceeding three hundred dollars
- 3 or imprisonment for thirty days, for each offence, and
- 4 any employee who may be injured by reason of an insuf-
- 5 ficient plank flooring or staging as set forth in section
- 6 one and section two shall not be deemed to have assumed
- 7 the risk thereby occasioned.

1 Section 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
