In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and One.

AN ACT

To prevent Substitutions in the Sale of Drugs, Medicines and Articles of Food and Drink.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any one,
2 by himself, his agents or servants, in the sale
3 of any article of food or drink, or any drug or
4 medicinal or proprietary preparation, to substitute
5 for or give or deliver for and instead of any such
6 article, drug or preparation bought or called for
7 under any trade or other identifying or distin-
8 guishing designation, any article other than the
9 one so bought or called for and designated, with-
10 out informing the purchaser of such substitution.

1 SECTION 2. A violation of this act shall be
2 punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred
3 dollars, or by imprisonment in a house of correc-
4 tion for a term not exceeding one year.
