### AN ACT

To establish the Salaries of the Clerks in the Department of the Treasurer and Receiver-General.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The salary of the first clerk in the  
2 department of the treasurer and receiver-general  
3 shall be twenty-six hundred dollars a year, the  
4 salary of the second clerk twenty-one hundred  
5 dollars a year, the salary of the third clerk sixteen  
6 hundred dollars a year, the salary of the receiv-  
7 ing teller eighteen hundred dollars a year, the  
8 salary of the paying teller eighteen hundred dol-  
9 lars a year, the salary of the assistant paying  
10 teller one thousand dollars a year, the salary of  
11 the cashier twenty-two hundred dollars a year,  
12 the salary of the assistant bookkeeper twelve  
13 hundred dollars a year, the salary of the fund  
14 clerk fifteen hundred dollars a year, the salary of

15 the warrant clerk twelve hundred dollars a year,  
16 the salary of the files clerk nine hundred dollars  
17 a year, the salary of the collateral legacy tax  
18 clerk nineteen hundred dollars a year, the salary  
19 of the deputy sealer of weights, measures and  
20 balances twelve hundred dollars a year, the salary  
21 of the stenographer nine hundred dollars a year,  
22 the salary of the messenger nine hundred dollars  
23 a year.

1 SECTION 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsis-  
2 tent with this act are hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect January  
2 first nineteen hundred and one.
