RESOLVE

In favor of Herman B. Cook.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the
2 treasury of the Commonwealth to Herman B. Cook of
3 Boston the sum of seventy-five dollars, in full compensa-
4 tion for the injuries to a horse owned by him and used
5 by a member of Troop D, cavalry, second brigade,
6 Massachusetts Volunteer Militia, while on duty under
7 orders at Framingham, in the month of May in the year
8 eighteen hundred and ninety-eight.
