In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and One.

AN ACT

To provide that Certain Police Officers in Cities shall have One Day off in every Twenty-seven Days.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. In every city which accepts the
2 provision of this act by vote of its city council,
3 police officers below the rank of captain shall be
4 allowed, without loss of pay, one day, or twenty-
5 four consecutive hours, in every twenty-seven
6 days, during which they shall not be required to
7 be on duty.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
