## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

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In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and One.

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### AN ACT

In addition to an Act making Appropriations for Sundry Miscellaneous Expenses authorized during the Present Year, and for Certain Other Expenses authorized by Law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned  
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of  
3 the Commonwealth from the ordinary revenue, for  
4 the purposes specified in certain acts and resolves  
5 of the present year, and for certain other ex-  
6 penses authorized by law, to wit:—

7 For certain repairs and improvements at the  
8 Westborough insane hospital, as authorized by  
9 chapter seventy-eight of the resolves of the present  
10 year, a sum not exceeding fifty-four hundred  
11 dollars.

12 For certain improvements at the state camp

13 ground for the purpose of securing good water,  
14 as authorized by chapter seventy-nine of the re-  
15 solves of the present year, a sum not exceeding  
16 two thousand dollars.

17 For the payment of a sum of money to the town  
18 of Middlefield on account of the breaking away of  
19 a dam in said town, as authorized by chapter  
20 eighty of the resolves of the present year, a sum  
21 not exceeding twelve thousand dollars.

22 For certain improvements at the Massachusetts  
23 school for the feeble-minded, as authorized by  
24 chapter eighty-one of the resolves of the present  
25 year, a sum not exceeding twenty-five thousand  
26 dollars.

27 For certain repairs and improvements at the  
28 Danvers insane hospital, as authorized by chapter  
29 eighty-two of the resolves of the present year, a  
30 sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars.

31 For painting and repairing buildings at the  
32 state camp ground, as authorized by chapter  
33 eighty-three of the resolves of the present year, a  
34 sum not exceeding four thousand dollars.

35 For the fire department of the city of Lowell  
36 for services rendered at a fire at the state hospital,  
37 as authorized by chapter eighty-four of the re-  
38 solves of the present year, the sum of one hundred  
39 and fifty dollars.

40 For such additional clerical assistance as the  
41 tax commissioner may find necessary for the dis-  
42 patch of public business, as authorized by chapter  
43 four hundred and forty-nine of the acts of the  
44 present year, a sum not exceeding one thousand

45 dollars, the same to be in addition to the sixteen  
46 thousand dollars appropriated by chapter sixteen  
47 of the acts of the present year.

48 For new conduits for steam pipes and electric  
49 wires for the state normal school at Framingham,  
50 as authorized by chapter eighty-five of the resolves  
51 of the present year, a sum not exceeding fifteen  
52 hundred dollars.

53 For the town of Chester, on account of the  
54 breaking of a dam in the town of Middlefield, as  
55 authorized by chapter eighty-seven of the resolves  
56 of the present year, a sum not exceeding six thou-  
57 sand dollars.

58 For the Bradford Durfee textile school of Fall  
59 River, as authorized by chapter eighty-eight of  
60 the resolves of the present year, the sum of thirty-  
61 five thousand dollars.

62 For collecting portraits of treasurers and re-  
63 ceivers general of the Commonwealth, as author-  
64 ized by chapter ninety-one of the resolves of the  
65 present year, a sum not exceeding one thousand  
66 dollars.

67 For printing a guide book of the state house,  
68 as authorized by chapter ninety-three of the re-  
69 solves of the present year, a sum not exceeding  
70 five hundred dollars.

71 For the protection of the town of Hadley  
72 against the further encroachments of the Con-  
73 necticut river, as authorized by chapter ninety-  
74 four of the resolves of the present year, the sum  
75 of fifteen thousand dollars, the same to be in addi-  
76 tion to any unexpended balance authorized by

77 chapter one hundred of the resolves of the year  
78 nineteen hundred.

79 For the compensation of inspectors of animals,  
80 a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars, the  
81 same to be in addition to the fifty-five hundred  
82 dollars appropriated by chapter eleven of the  
83 acts of the present year.

84 For a new dormitory at the Westfield normal  
85 school, as authorized by chapter ninety-five of  
86 the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-  
87 ceeding fifty thousand dollars.

88 For the completion of the monument on Dor-  
89 chester Heights, as authorized by chapter ninety-  
90 seven of the resolves of the present year, a sum  
91 not exceeding eight thousand dollars.

92 For the instruction of the adult blind at their  
93 homes by the Perkins Institution and Massachu-  
94 setts School for the Blind, as authorized by  
95 chapter ninety-eight of the resolves of the  
96 present year, a sum not exceeding thirty-six  
97 hundred dollars.

98 For giving instruction in riding to the mounted  
99 militia, as authorized by chapter ninety-nine of  
100 the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-  
101 ceeding four thousand dollars.

102 For building breakwaters, sea walls or other  
103 structures in the town of Hull by the board of  
104 harbor and land commissioners, as authorized by  
105 chapter four hundred and eighty-three of the  
106 acts of the present year, a sum not exceeding ten  
107 thousand dollars.

108 For the salary of the judge of probate and in-

109 solvency for the county of Nantucket, as author-  
110 ized by chapter four hundred and eighty-five of  
111 the acts of the present year, the sum of two hun-  
112 dred dollars, the same to be in addition to any  
113 amount heretofore appropriated for the same  
114 purpose.

115 For the salary of the register of probate and  
116 insolvency for the county of Nantucket, as au-  
117 thorized by chapter four hundred and eighty-five  
118 of the acts of the present year, the sum of two  
119 hundred dollars, the same to be in addition to  
120 any amount heretofore appropriated for the same  
121 purpose.

122 For Sanford Weston, as authorized by chapter  
123 one hundred and three of the resolves of the  
124 present year, the sum of one hundred and twenty-  
125 five dollars.

126 For surveys and estimates by the board of  
127 harbor and land commissioners as to the cost of  
128 constructing a ship canal from Taunton river to  
129 Boston harbor, as authorized by chapter one  
130 hundred and four of the resolves of the present  
131 year, a sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars.

132 For compensation and expenses of a committee  
133 to consider the advisability of constructing a dam  
134 across the Charles river between the cities of  
135 Boston and Cambridge, as authorized by chapter  
136 one hundred and five of the resolves of the  
137 present year, a sum not exceeding ten thousand  
138 dollars.

139 For the Massachusetts agricultural college, as  
140 authorized by chapter one hundred and six of

141 the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-  
142 ceeding four hundred dollars.

143 For Annie Stone, executrix, as authorized by  
144 chapter one hundred and eight of the resolves of  
145 the present year, the sum of thirteen hundred  
146 thirty-two dollars and sixty-two cents.

147 The treasurer and receiver general is hereby  
148 directed to pay to the town of Medway such  
149 sum of money as shall equal twenty-five per  
150 centum of the sum refunded to Lawrence  
151 McGinnis on account of the fee paid by said  
152 McGinnis to the town for licenses granted for  
153 the sale of intoxicating liquors, as authorized by  
154 chapter four hundred and ninety-two of the acts  
155 of the present year.

156 For enlarging the Wachusett mountain state  
157 reservation, and for improving the mountain  
158 roadway thereon, as authorized by chapter four  
159 hundred and ninety-six of the acts of the present  
160 year, a sum not exceeding twenty-five thousand  
161 dollars.

162 For the expenses of the inspection of electric  
163 meters, as authorized by chapter four hundred  
164 and ninety-seven of the acts of the present year,  
165 a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars.

166 For clerical assistance for the board of gas and  
167 electric light commissioners, as authorized by  
168 chapter four hundred and ninety-nine of the acts  
169 of the present year, a sum not exceeding six  
170 hundred dollars, the same to be in addition to  
171 any amount heretofore appropriated for the same  
172 purpose.

173 For the salary of the assistant district attorney  
174 for the southeastern district, as authorized by  
175 chapter five hundred of the acts of the present  
176 year, the sum of two hundred dollars, the same  
177 to be in addition to any amount heretofore ap-  
178 propriated for the same purpose.

179 For the consolidation and arranging of the  
180 public statutes, to enable the commissioners to  
181 incorporate in their report made to the general  
182 court the legislation of the present session, as  
183 provided for by a joint order adopted June  
184 twelfth of the present year, a sum not exceeding  
185 ten thousand dollars, the same to be in addition  
186 to any amount heretofore appropriated for the  
187 same purpose.

188 For expenses of committees of the present  
189 legislature, to include such expenses as may be  
190 found necessary by the joint special committee  
191 on the consolidation and arranging of the Public  
192 Statutes, a sum not exceeding fifteen thousand  
193 dollars, the same to be in addition to any amount  
194 heretofore appropriated for the same purpose.

195 For expenses in connection with removing the  
196 offices of certain state officials from places out-  
197 side the state house to the state house, and  
198 making suitable provision for their accommo-  
199 dation, as authorized by chapter one hundred  
200 and nine of the resolves of the present year, a  
201 sum not exceeding five thousand dollars.

202 For publishing a report of the public exercises  
203 commemorative of Roger Wolcott, late governor  
204 of the Commonwealth, as authorized by chapter



205 one hundred and ten of the resolves of the  
206 present year, a sum not exceeding one thousand  
207 dollars.

208 For John J. Quinn, as authorized by chapter  
209 one hundred and twelve of the resolves of the  
210 present year, the sum of twenty-five hundred  
211 dollars.

212 For the expense of rebuilding the bridge over  
213 the Merrimac river between the city of New-  
214 buryport and the town of Salisbury, as author-  
215 ized by chapter five hundred and seventeen of  
216 the acts of the present year, the sum of twenty-  
217 five thousand dollars.

218 For improving the channel at the entrance of  
219 Bass river between the towns of Dennis and  
220 Yarmouth, as authorized by chapter one hundred  
221 and thirteen of the resolves of the present year,  
222 a sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars.

223 To provide for printing and distributing maps  
224 showing the division of the Commonwealth into  
225 congressional districts, as authorized by chapter  
226 one hundred and fourteen of the resolves of the  
227 present year, a sum not exceeding five hundred  
228 dollars.

229 For salaries and expenses for the employees  
230 of the topographical survey, as provided for by  
231 Public Statutes, chapter sixteen, resolves, chap-  
232 ters four, twenty-one and sixty-seven, of the  
233 present year, from January first up to the date  
234 when the commission was abolished, by chapter  
235 four hundred and sixty-nine of the acts of the  
236 present year, the sum of three thousand eight

237 hundred forty-two dollars and seventy-nine  
238 cents.

239 For expenses in connection with the dedica-  
240 tion of tablets or monuments at Andersonville,  
241 Georgia, on grounds formerly occupied as a con-  
242 federate prison, as authorized by chapter one  
243 hundred and fifteen of the resolves of the present  
244 year, a sum not exceeding thirty-eight hundred  
245 dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon  
2 its passage.
