[To accompany the petition of George H. Gibney and others, a committee of the town of Hamilton, that certain restrictions on the use of Willow street and Union street in said town may be removed and that authority may be granted to lay out said Union street and maintain and continue both of said streets at a level with the Asbury Grove branch, so called, of the Boston and Maine Railroad. Railroads.]

AN ACT

Relative to the Maintenance of Willow and Union Streets in the Town of Hamilton.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The two ways known as Willow
2 street and Union street in the town of Hamilton
3 may hereafter be maintained and continued as
4 town ways across the Asbury Grove branch, so
5 called, of the Boston and Maine Railroad, at the
6 same level with said branch railroad, except that

7 in the case of said Union street the selectmen of
8 said town shall first so lay out said street, and
9 that said laying-out shall first be accepted by a
10 majority of the legal voters of said town present
11 and voting thereon at an annual town meeting or
12 at a special meeting duly called for the purpose;
13 and no other action or authority shall be neces-
14 sary for the laying out of said Union street or for
15 the maintenance and continuance of said streets
16 as aforesaid.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
