AN ACT

Relative to the Practice of Pharmacy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The fourth clause of section nine
2 of chapter one hundred of the Public Statutes as
3 amended by chapter one hundred and fifty-eight
4 of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and
5 eighty-four is hereby amended by adding at the
6 end thereof the following:— *provided, however,*
7 that the phrase “or to a person known to have
8 been supported in whole or in part by public
9 charity at any time during the twelve months next
10 preceding the date of the license,” shall not apply
11 in cases where the sale of liquor is made upon the
12 prescription of a duly registered physician, — so as
13 to read as follows:—

14 Fourth, That no sale or delivery of liquor shall
15 be made on the premises described in the license

16 to a person known to be a drunkard, to an intoxi-
17 cated person, or to a person who is known to have
18 been intoxicated within the six months next pre-
19 ceding, or to a minor, either for his own use, the
20 use of his parent, or of any other person, or to a
21 person known to have been supported in whole or
22 in part by public charity at any time during the
23 twelve months next preceding the date of the
24 license: *provided, however*, that the phrase “or to
25 a person known to have been supported in whole
26 or in part by public charity at any time during the
27 twelve months next preceding the date of the
28 license,” shall not apply in cases where the sale
29 of liquor is made upon the prescription of a duly
30 registered physician.

1 SECTION 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsis-
2 ent herewith are hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
