RESOLVE

To authorize the Board of Harbor and Land Commissioners to make an Estimate of the Cost of improving the Harbor at Apponagansett in the town of Dartmouth.

1 *Resolved*, That the board of harbor and land commis-
2 sioners are hereby directed to make, or cause to be
3 made, a survey and estimate as to the advisability and
4 cost of improving the harbor at Apponagansett in the
5 town of Dartmouth, by constructing a breakwater or
6 otherwise at its entrance. Said board shall report thereon
7 to the next general court, and may expend for the pur-
8 poses of this resolve a sum not exceeding five hundred
9 dollars.
