AN ACT

To authorize Towns to appropriate Money for Memorials of those who served in the Spanish-American War.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Any town may, at its annual meet-
2 ing or any meeting called for the purpose, by vote
3 appropriate money for erecting headstones or other
4 monuments at the graves of persons who served
5 in the military or naval service of the United
6 States in the Spanish-American war; for erecting
7 monuments in the memory of soldiers or sailors
8 who died in the service of the United States in
9 said war; and for keeping in repair or decorating
10 graves, monuments or other memorials erected to
11 the memory of such soldiers or sailors.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
