Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and One.

AN ACT

Further to define the Duties of the Board of Registration in Pharmacy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section nine of chapter three hun-
2 dred and ninety-seven of the acts of the year
3 eighteen hundred and ninety-six is hereby
4 amended by striking out in the seventh line of
5 said section the words "or may revoke it alto-
6 gether," and in the ninth line of said section the
7 words "or revoked."

1 SECTION 2. Said chapter three hundred and
2 ninety-seven is further amended by inserting after

3 section twenty-four the following three new sec-
4 tions to be numbered, respectively, sections twenty-
5 five, twenty-six and twenty-seven, to wit: —

6 *Section 25.* In case a charge or complaint is
7 pending against a registered pharmacist of the
8 Commonwealth, such pharmacist or his counsel
9 shall have access to all papers and documents in
10 the possession of the board of registration in
11 pharmacy relating to such pharmacist.

12 *Section 26.* Whoever violates any of the pro-
13 visions of this act, not otherwise specifically
14 provided for, shall for each offence be punished
15 by fine not less than fifty dollars.

16 *Section 27.* When a person is convicted of the
17 violation of any provisions of this act, the court in
18 which or the magistrate before whom such con-
19 viction is had, shall send to the board of registra-
20 tion in pharmacy a certificate under seal showing
21 the time and place of such conviction.
