### AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Compensation of the Members of the General Court, for the Compensation of the Officers thereof and for Expenses in Connection therewith.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned  
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury  
3 of the Commonwealth from the ordinary revenue,  
4 for the purposes specified, for the year ending on  
5 the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred  
6 and two, to wit: —

7 For the compensation of senators, thirty thousand  
8 seven hundred and fifty dollars. [Rev. Laws,  
9 chap. 3, sect. 8.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$30,750.)

10 For compensation for travel of senators, a sum  
11 not exceeding thirty-two hundred dollars. [Rev.  
12 Laws, chap. 3, sect. 8.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$3,200.)

13 For the compensation of representatives, one  
14 hundred and eighty thousand seven hundred and  
15 fifty dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 3, sect. 8.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$180,750.)

16 For compensation for travel of representatives,  
17 a sum not exceeding twenty thousand dollars.  
18 [Rev. Laws, chap. 3, sect. 8.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$20,000.)

19 For the compensation of the chaplains of the  
20 senate and house of representatives, three hun-  
21 dred dollars each. [Rev. Laws, chap. 3, sect. 14.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$600.)

22 For the salaries of the clerks of the senate and  
23 house of representatives, three thousand dollars  
24 each. [Rev. Laws, chap. 3, sect. 10.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$6,000.)

25 For the salaries of the assistant clerks of the  
26 senate and house of representatives, two thousand  
27 dollars each. [Rev. Laws, chap. 3, sects. 12 and  
28 13.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$4,000.)

29 For such additional clerical assistance to the  
30 clerks of the senate and house of representatives  
31 as may be necessary for the proper despatch of  
32 public business, a sum not exceeding three thou-  
33 sand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 3, sect. 12.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$3,000.)

34 For the salary of the sergeant-at-arms, thirty-  
35 five hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 10,  
36 sect. 10.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$3,500.)

37 For the salary of the first clerk in the office of  
38 the sergeant-at-arms, twenty-two hundred dollars.  
39 [Rev. Laws, chap. 10, sect. 10.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$2,200.)

40 For the salaries of the door-keepers of the senate  
41 and house of representatives, fifteen hundred dol-  
42 lars each. [Rev. Laws, chap. 10.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$3,000.)

43 For the compensation of assistant door-keepers,  
44 postmaster, messengers and pages to the senate  
45 and house of representatives, a sum not exceeding  
46 thirty-one thousand five hundred dollars. [Rev.  
47 Laws, chap. 10.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$31,500.)

48 For stationery for the senate, purchased by the  
49 clerk, a sum not exceeding eight hundred dollars.  
50 [Rev. Laws, chap. 6, sect. 49.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$900.)

51 For stationery for the house of representatives,  
52 purchased by the clerk, a sum not exceeding  
53 twelve hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 6,  
54 sect. 49.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$1,500.)

55 For printing and binding ordered by the senate  
56 and house of representatives, or by concurrent  
57 order of the two branches, a sum not exceeding

58 twenty-seven thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,  
86 chap. 6, sect. 49.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$30,000.)

60 For printing and binding the manual for the  
61 general court, under the direction of the clerks of  
62 the senate and house of representatives, a sum not  
63 exceeding four thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,  
64 chap. 9, sect. 10.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$4,000.)

65 For books, stationery, postage, printing and  
66 advertising, ordered by the sergeant-at-arms, a  
67 sum not exceeding one thousand dollars. [Rev.  
68 Laws, chap. 6, sect. 49.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$1,000.)

69 For contingent expenses of the senate and  
70 house of representatives, and necessary expenses  
71 in and about the state house, a sum not exceeding  
72 six thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 10,  
73 sect. 17.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$6,000.)

74 For authorized expenses of committees of the  
75 present general court, to include clerical assist-  
76 ance to committees authorized to employ the  
77 same, also expenses of advertising hearings before  
78 committees, a sum not exceeding twenty-five  
79 thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 6, sect. 43.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$25,000.)

80 For expenses of summoning witnesses before  
81 committees, and for fees of such witnesses, a sum  
82 not exceeding two hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws,  
83 chap. 6, sect. 51.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$200.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
