AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in the Office of the Prison Commissioners and for Sundry Reformatory Expenses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-
6 ber, nineteen hundred and two, to wit: —

7 For the salary of the chairman of the prison
8 commissioners, four thousand dollars. [Rev.
9 Laws, chap. 222, sect. 1.]

(Salary fixed 1901, appropriation \$3,875)

10 For the salary of the secretary of the prison
11 commissioners, twenty-five hundred dollars. [Rev.
12 Laws, chap. 222, sect. 2.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$2,500.)

13 For clerical assistance in the office of the prison
14 commissioners, a sum not exceeding four thousand
15 seven hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 222,
16 sect. 2.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$4,680.)

17 For the salaries of the agents of the prison com-
18 missioners, fifty-two hundred dollars. [Rev.
19 Laws, chap. 225, sect. 136.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$5,200.)

20 For travelling expenses of the prison commis-
21 sioners and of the secretary and agents of said
22 commissioners, a sum not exceeding three thous-
23 and one hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap.
24 222.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$3,500.)

25 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
26 prison commissioners, a sum not exceeding fifteen
27 hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 222.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$1,900.)

28 For the salary of the agent for aiding dis-
29 charged female prisoners, one thousand dollars.
30 [Rev. Laws, chap. 225, sect. 137.]

31 For the expenses of the agent for aiding dis-
32 charged female prisoners, including assistance
33 rendered to said prisoners, a sum not exceeding
34 three thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 225,
35 sect. 137.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$3,000.)

36 For aiding prisoners discharged from the
37 Massachusetts reformatory, a sum not exceeding
38 five thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 225,
39 sect. 136.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$5,000.)

40 For aiding prisoners discharged from the state
41 prison, a sum not exceeding three thousand
42 dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 225, sect. 136.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$3,000.)

43 For expenses incurred in removing prisoners
44 to and from state and county prisons, a sum not
45 exceeding one thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
46 chap. 225, sect. 108.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$1,000.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
