

HOUSE No. 385.

[Bill accompanying the petition of Frank G. Creamer for legislation to prevent or restrict the running at large or the pasturing of bulls. Agriculture. January 28.]

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Two

AN ACT

Relative to the Pasturing of Bulls.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for the owner or
2 keeper of a bull more than eighteen months old to per-
3 mit the bull to be at large in a pasture or other place,
4 except in a yard attached to a barn or stable and se-
5 curely fenced, after such owner or keeper has been
6 notified in writing by the owner or occupier of a pasture
7 or other land adjoining the pasture or other place in
8 which the bull has been at large, to remove or restrain
9 the said bull.

1 SECTION 2. Any person who violates any provision
2 of this act shall be subject to a fine of not more than
3 dollars for each offence.
