## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Two.

### AN ACT

To incorporate the Brookside Club in the Town of Bourne.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Morton G. Baldwin, Charles G. Gibson,  
2 William M. Prest, Charles F. Chamberlayne and Thomas  
3 Jefferson, their associates and successors, are made a cor-  
4 poration by the name of the Brookside Club, for the  
5 purpose of maintaining a club house, grounds for recrea-  
6 tion or the playing of athletic games and a reading room,  
7 in the town of Bourne, with the powers and privileges  
8 and subject to the duties, liabilities and restrictions set  
9 forth in all general laws which now are, or which may  
10 hereafter be, in force applicable to such corporations.

1 SECTION 2. Said corporation, for the purposes afore-  
2 said, may hold real and personal estate to an amount not  
3 exceeding ten thousand dollars, and shall have the right  
4 to mortgage its property to secure any indebtedness in-  
5 curred in acquiring the same.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
