

HOUSE No. 689.

[Bill accompanying the petition of John J. Gartland, Jr., and another for legislation to forbid trust companies establishing branch offices. Banks and Banking. February 3.]

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Two.

AN ACT

To prohibit Trust Companies from Establishing Branch Offices.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any trust com-
2 pany doing business in this Commonwealth to establish
3 or maintain a branch office or to receive or pay out de-
4 posits or checks in any place other than that in which
5 their regular business is transacted.

1 SECTION 2. If any trust company violates any pro-
2 vision of this act, its charter shall thereupon be revoked
3 and shall be null and void.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon the first
2 day of July, nineteen hundred and two.
