

HOUSE No. 1001.

[Bill accompanying the petition of Thomas L. Davis for legislation relative to the granting of licenses to dealers in junk and old metals and second-hand articles. Judiciary. February 5]

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Two.

AN ACT

To provide that Junk Dealers and Dealers in Second-hand Articles shall be licensed separately.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any city or town
2 to grant a license to any person to be a dealer in, or to
3 keep a shop for, the purchase, sale or barter of junk and
4 old metals, and also to be a dealer in, or to keep a shop
5 for, the purchase, sale or barter of second-hand articles ;
6 but licenses to deal in junk and old metals as aforesaid,
7 and to deal in second-hand articles as aforesaid, shall be
8 granted separately and not to the same person.

1 SECTION 2. Any license already granted and now in
2 force in any city or town, authorizing any person to act
3 as a dealer in junk and old metals and also as a dealer in
4 second-hand articles, shall continue in force until the
5 day of in the year nineteen hundred and two,
6 and shall thereupon cease and be void.
