RESOLVE

To provide for the Erection of a Memorial to Massachusetts Soldiers who took Part in the Siege of Vicksburg.

1 *Resolved*, That a sum not exceeding five thousand
2 dollars is hereby appropriated out of the treasury of the
3 Commonwealth, to be expended, under the direction of
4 a commission to consist of three persons appointed by
5 the governor, in the erection of a suitable memorial of
6 the three Massachusetts regiments, namely, the twenty-
7 ninth, the thirty-fifth and thirty-sixth, which took part in
8 the siege of Vicksburg. The commission shall serve
9 without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for neces-
10 sary expenses actually incurred. The design for the
11 memorial shall be submitted to and approved by the
12 governor and council, who shall approve all bills con-
13 tracted hereunder before they are sent to the auditor for
14 payment. The said memorial shall be erected in the
15 National Park, near Vicksburg, at a spot to be selected
16 by the said commission and by the national military park
17 commission, and shall be completed on or before the first
18 day of December in the year nineteen hundred and two.
