AN ACT

To authorize the Berkshire Street Railway Company to carry Baggage and small parcels of Merchandise and to carry Freight, Merchandise, Baggage and Market Produce in a part of the town of Lenox.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Berkshire Street Railway
2 Company is hereby authorized to act as a com-
3 mon carrier of baggage and small parcels of
4 merchandise in any city or town in which it is
5 authorized to operate its railway: *provided, how-*
6 *ever,* that said company shall not so act in any
7 city or town until authorized so to do by the
8 board of aldermen or selectmen thereof; and
9 *provided, further,* that said company shall be
10 subject to such ordinances or by-laws as may
11 from time to time be made by any such city or
12 town, and shall also be subject to the provisions

13 of chapter seventy-three of the Public Statutes
14 and all other laws relating to common carriers.

1 SECTION 2. The Berkshire Street Railway
2 Company is hereby authorized to act as a com-
3 mon carrier of freight, merchandise, baggage and
4 market produce in the town of Lenox, between
5 Lenox village and the Lenox steam railroad
6 station, subject to all the provisions contained in
7 section one of this act.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
