

HOUSE No. 1282.

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Two.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Bay State Accident Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Charles H. Wilson, Delmont L.
2 Weeks, Guy W. Cox and Harry G. Lowe, their
3 associates and successors, are hereby made a cor-
4 poration by the name of the Bay State Accident
5 Association, for the purpose of insuring street
6 railway corporations, except such as are herein-
7 after excluded, against loss arising from claims for
8 damages on account of injury to persons or on
9 account of the death of persons caused by such
10 street railway corporations; and for this purpose
11 shall have all the powers and privileges and be

12 subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities
13 set forth in all general laws, now or hereafter in
14 force, relating to mutual insurance companies, so
15 far as the same shall be applicable.

1 SECTION 2. Said corporation shall effect in-
2 surance only in the class of cases specified in
3 section one of this act, and shall not do business
4 until its by-laws and form of policy have been
5 submitted to and approved by the insurance com-
6 missioner, nor until at least four of the street
7 railway corporations of this Commonwealth shall
8 have applied for insurance therein. It shall in-
9 sure no corporation whose gross earnings for the
10 year ending on the thirtieth day of September
11 next preceding the application for such insurance
12 exceed the sum of five hundred thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
