RESOLVE

To direct the Board of Railroad Commissioners to investigate the Matter of Passenger Fares charged by Railroad Companies.

1 *Resolved*, That the board of railroad commissioners is
2 hereby directed to investigate the matter of passenger
3 fares upon the several railroads operating within the
4 Commonwealth, and to report whether in their judgment
5 a uniform rate not exceeding two cents a mile should be
6 charged for passenger transportation thereon, and to
7 state in writing the reasons for their conclusions; the
8 said report to be made to the next general court on or
9 before the fifteenth day of January, nineteen hundred
10 and three.
