### AN ACT

To authorize Licensed Innholders in the City of Boston to provide Barbers for Guests during Certain Hours on the Lord's Day.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Licensed innholders in the city of Boston  
2 may provide barbers up to the hour of twelve o'clock,  
3 noon, on the Lord's day for guests resorting to their  
4 hotels for food and lodging.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
