In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Two.

### RESOLVE

To authorize the Board of Harbor and Land Commissioners to make a Survey and Estimate to determine the Cost of acquiring a Portion of Mount Tom and Mount Nonotuck as a State Reservation.

1     *Resolved*, That the board of harbor and land commis-  
2 sioners is hereby authorized to make surveys, examina-  
3 tions and estimates to determine the probable cost of  
4 acquiring an area of about three thousand acres of land  
5 situate on or about Mount Tom and Mount Nonotuck in  
6 the county of Hampshire, suitable for a state reserva-  
7 tion, and make a report on the same to the general court  
8 on or before January fifteenth, nineteen hundred and  
9 three. To defray the expenses of the survey and exami-  
10 nation they may expend a sum not exceeding two  
11 thousand dollars.

12     Said board and its employees may enter upon land  
13 within this Commonwealth when it may be necessary  
14 for the purposes of this resolve, and may erect works,  
15 stations, buildings and appurtenances requisite for that  
16 purpose, if they do no unnecessary injury.

17     Sections ten, eleven and twelve of chapter one of the  
18 Revised Laws shall apply to the settlement for any  
19 damage done in connection with the work hereby au-  
20 thorized.
