AN ACT

To authorize the City of Boston to pay a Sum of Money to the Widow of Frederick P. Ingalls.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The city of Boston is hereby
2 authorized to pay to the widow of Frederick P.
3 Ingalls, late an officer in attendance upon the
4 sessions of the municipal court of the city of
5 Boston for criminal business, a sum of money not
6 exceeding one-half of the annual salary of said
7 Frederick P. Ingalls: *provided*, that the sum here-
8 by authorized to be paid shall not exceed the
9 amount to which he would have been entitled if
10 he had lived and continued to serve as such em-
11 ployee until the first day of January next succeed-
12 ing the day of his death.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
