RESOLVE

To provide for reimbursing the Town of Northfield for aiding Dwight Cook and Family.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the
2 treasury of the Commonwealth to the town of North-
3 field the sum of nineteen hundred and eighteen dollars
4 and six cents, said sum being the amount which said
5 town has paid since eighteen hundred and ninety-four as
6 aid to Dwight Cook and family, they having no known
7 settlement in said town, but paid by the town under a
8 misapprehension of facts.
