AN ACT

To authorize the State Board of Education to furnish Additional Facilities for Instruction in Natural History, Geography and Kindred Subjects in the Public Schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The state board of education is
2 hereby authorized to purchase lantern or projec-
3 tion slides for the pictorial illustration of natural
4 history, geography and other subjects of study
5 authorized in the public schools. Such slides
6 may be loaned to the schools of the several towns
7 and cities and may be used at the discretion of
8 the school authorities in lectures for artisans,
9 mechanics and other citizens. The board of edu-
10 cation may establish such regulations as it deems
11 necessary relative to the use of such slides and

12 the necessary expenses for expressage, injury or
13 loss that may accompany such use.

1 SECTION 2. The sum of twelve hundred dol-
2 lars is hereby appropriated for the purposes of
3 the foregoing section for the year beginning on
4 the first day of January, nineteen hundred and
5 three.
