In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Three.

AN ACT

Relative to the Nomination and Election of Aldermen in the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The aldermen of the city of Boston
2 shall be thirteen in number, nominated and elected
3 by and from the citizens at large.

1 SECTION 2. The nominations shall be made in
2 caucuses throughout the city; every political
3 party making such nominations shall nominate
4 eight candidates, and the eight candidates receiv-
5 ing the eight highest numbers of votes will be the
6 candidates of the party.

1 SECTION 3. The thirteen candidates receiving
2 at the election the thirteen highest numbers of
3 votes shall be elected.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
