

[Bill accompanying the petition of Wallace C. Ransden for legislation to legalize picketing or patrolling during strikes, lockouts or other labor disputes. Employers and Employees. January 8.]

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Four.

AN ACT

To allow Peaceful Communications with Applicants for Positions during Strikes, Lockouts and Labor Disputes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. In case of a strike or lockout or
2 other dispute between an employer and his
3 employces, it shall be lawful for the employees,
4 or for other persons, to walk upon the public
5 streets and ways in the vicinity of the place of
6 employment or in any other place to which they
7 have lawful access, and in a peaceful way to
8 converse with persons intending to go to such
9 employer for work, for the purpose of informing
10 them of actual facts in order to induce them not
11 to enter into or not to continue in said employer's
12 service.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
