AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in
the Office of the Insurance Commissioner.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury
3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, for the year ending on
5 the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hun-
6 dred and four, to wit:—

7 For the salary of the insurance commissioner,
8 thirty-five hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap.
9 118, sect. 4.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$3,500.)

10 For the salary of the deputy insurance com-
11 missioner, twenty-five hundred dollars. [Rev.
12 Laws, chap. 118, sect. 5.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$2,500.)

13 For the salary of the actuary in the insurance
14 department, two thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
15 chap. 118, sect. 5.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$2,000.)

16 For the salary of the examiner in the insurance

17 department, two thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
18 chap. 118, sect. 5.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$2,000.)

19 For the salary of the chief clerk in the insur-
20 ance department, two thousand dollars. [Rev.
21 Laws, chap. 118, sect. 5.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$2,000.)

22 For the salary of the second clerk in the insur-
23 ance department, fifteen hundred dollars. [Rev.
24 Laws, chap. 118, sect. 5.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$1,500.)

25 For the salary of the third clerk in the insur-
26 ance department, twelve hundred dollars. [Rev.
27 Laws, chap. 118, sect. 5.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$1,200.)

28 For such additional clerks and assistants as the
29 insurance commissioner may find necessary for
30 the despatch of public business, a sum not exceed-
31 ing twenty-six thousand and twenty-five dollars.
32 [Rev. Laws, chap. 118, sect. 5.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$26,025.)

33 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
34 insurance commissioner, a sum not exceeding four
35 thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 118.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$4,000.)

36 For printing and binding the annual report of
37 the insurance commissioner, a sum not exceeding
38 forty-six hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 9,
39 sect. 7; Acts 1902, chap. 438.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$4,600.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
