In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Four

AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in the Department of the Adjutant-General and for sundry other Military Expenses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, for the year ending on
5 the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred
6 and four, to wit:—

7 For the salary of the adjutant-general, thirty-
8 six hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16, sect.
9 14.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$3,600.)

10 For the salary of the first clerk of the adjutant-
11 general's department, twenty-two hundred dollars.
12 [Rev. Laws, chap. 16, sect. 14,]

(Appropriation 1903, \$2,200.)

13 For the salary of the second clerk of the ad-
14 jutant-general's department, sixteen hundred
15 dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16, sect. 14.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$1,600.)

16 For the salary of an additional clerk in the
17 adjutant-general's department, two thousand dol-
18 lars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16, sect. 14.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$2,000.)

19 For the salaries of the two extra clerks in the
20 adjutant-general's department, twelve hundred
21 dollars each. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16, sect. 14.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$2,400.)

22 For the salary of the messenger of the adjutant-
23 general's department, eight hundred dollars.
24 [Rev. Laws, chap. 16, sect. 14.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$800.)

25 For such additional clerical assistance as the
26 adjutant-general may deem necessary, and for
27 compensation of employees at the state arsenal, a
28 sum not exceeding seven thousand one hundred
29 dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16, sect. 14.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$7,100.)

30 For compensation of officers and men of the
31 volunteer militia, a sum not exceeding one hun-
32 dred and sixty-five thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
33 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$150,000.)

34 For the transportation of officers and men of
35 the volunteer militia, when on military duty, a
36 sum not exceeding nineteen thousand dollars.
37 [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$19,000.)

38 For incidental and contingent expenses in the

39 adjutant-general's department, a sum not exceed-
40 ing thirty-five hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws,
41 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$3,500.)

42 For rent of brigade and battalion headquarters
43 and company armories, a sum not exceeding thirty-
44 eight thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$38,000.)

45 For quartermaster's supplies, a sum not exceed-
46 ing ten thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$10,000.)

47 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
48 quartermaster-general's department, a sum not
49 exceeding five thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
50 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$5,000.)

51 For grading and care of the camp-ground and
52 buildings of the Commonwealth at Framingham, a
53 sum not exceeding two thousand five hundred
54 dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$2,400.)

55 For expenses in connection with military ac-
56 counts not otherwise provided for, a sum not
57 exceeding four thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
58 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$4,000.)

59 For heating, lighting, furnishing and caring
60 for the armories recently erected in certain cities
61 of the Commonwealth, for the use of the volun-
62 teer militia, a sum not exceeding thirty-five thou-
63 sand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$35,000.)

64 For services of janitors of certain armories, a
65 sum not exceeding seven thousand dollars. [Rev.
66 Laws, chap. 16, sect. 117.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$7,000.)

67 For allowance and repairs of clothing of the
68 volunteer militia, a sum not exceeding nine thou-
69 sand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$9,000.)

70 For expenses in connection with the rifle prac-
71 tice of volunteer militia, a sum not exceeding
72 twenty-three thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
73 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$20,000.)

74 For furnishing, repair and care of the United
75 States steamer "Inca," a sum not exceeding
76 twelve hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$1,200.)

77 For allowance to officers of the militia for care
78 and responsibility of property, a sum not exceed-
79 ing five thousand one hundred and fifty dollars.
80 [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$5,150.)

81 For printing and binding the annual report,
82 a sum not exceeding eleven hundred dollars.
83 [Rev. Laws, chap. 9; Acts 1902, chap. 438.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$1,100.)

84 For the salary of the surgeon-general, twelve
85 hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16, sect. 18.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$1,200.)

86 For medical supplies for use of the volunteer
87 militia, and for incidental and contingent expenses
88 of the surgeon-general, including printing the

89 annual report, a sum not exceeding two thousand
90 four hundred and seventy-five dollars. [Rev.
91 Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$2,475.)

92 For expenses in connection with the examina-
93 tion of recruits for the militia, a sum not exceed-
94 ing twenty-six hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws,
95 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1903, \$2,600.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
