AN ACT

Relative to the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors in Restaurants.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. A license for the sale of intoxicating
- 2 liquors is hereby established, to be known as a restaurant
- 3 license.
- 1 Section 2. The said restaurant license shall be issued
- 2 to common victuallers holding a first-class license for the
- 3 sale of intoxicating liquors, and to them only, upon the
- 4 condition, however, that such common victuallers shall
- 5 provide and maintain as a part of, or in connection with,
- 6 the premises used by them as such licensed common
- 7 victuallers, suitable restaurant accommodations for the
- 8 serving of meals.

- Section 3. The licensee under said restaurant license shall be allowed to sell intoxicating liquors to be drunk on the premises used for such restaurant purposes, but not at any bar, between the hours of six in the morning and twelve in the evening on every day in the year, excepting Sundays; but nothing herein contained shall prohibit or restrict the right of said licensee under said restaurant license to sell intoxicating liquors at a bar under the provisions of any other license held by him.
- 1 Section 4. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent 2 herewith are hereby repealed.
- 1 Section 5. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
