### AN ACT

Relative to the Qualifications of Superintendents of Schools.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 In all superintending districts where any portion of  
2 the expense is borne by the Commonwealth, the state  
3 board of education shall determine, by examination or  
4 otherwise, the qualifications of candidates for the position  
5 of superintendent of public schools; and, after the first  
6 day of January nineteen hundred and five, no person  
7 shall be eligible for such position who does not hold a  
8 certificate of fitness and competency from said board.
