### AN ACT

Relative to Expenditures by the Board of Commissioners for the Promotion of Uniformity of Legislation in the United States.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The board of commissioners for  
2 the promotion of uniformity of legislation in the  
3 United States is hereby authorized to expend a  
4 sum not exceeding one thousand dollars, to carry  
5 out the purposes provided for by chapter four  
6 hundred and five of the acts of the year eighteen  
7 hundred and ninety-one and acts in amendment  
8 thereof, and for this purpose may deputize one of  
9 its members to travel outside of the Common-  
10 wealth whenever in its judgment it is expedient  
11 that a conference should be held in other states.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
