RESOLVE

Relative to Increased Court Room Accommodations for the
County of Suffolk.

1 *Resolved*, That a commission of three persons be ap-
2 pointed, one by the governor, one by the mayor of the
3 city of Boston, and the third chosen by the two appointed
4 as aforesaid, to serve without compensation, whose duty
5 it shall be to take into consideration the matter of pro-
6 viding additional court rooms and such other accommo-
7 dations as may be necessary for the prompt administration
8 and disposal of justice in the county of Suffolk. They
9 are authorized to employ experts, prepare plans, and
10 shall report an estimate of the cost of the proposed ex-
11 tension, including land, to the next General Court, not
12 later than the fifteenth day of January. The said com-
13 mission may expend in carrying out the provisions of
14 this act a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars, to be
15 paid by the county of Suffolk.
