AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses
in the Executive Department of the Common-
wealth.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury
3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, for the year ending on
5 the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hun-
6 dred and five, to wit:—
7 For the compensation of the lieutenant-gov-
8 ernor, two thousand dollars, and for that of the
9 executive council, sixty-four hundred dollars.
10 For travelling expenses of the executive council,
11 a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars.

13 For the salary of the private secretary of the
14 governor, twenty-five hundred dollars. [Rev.
15 Laws, chap. 4, sect. 5.]

16 For the salary of the executive secretary, twenty-
17 five hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 4, sect.
18 6; Acts 1904, chap. 268.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$2,500.)

19 For the salary of the executive stenographer, a
20 sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars. [Rev.
21 Laws, chap. 4, sect. 7.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$1,500.)

22 For clerical assistance for the executive depart-
23 ment, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars.
24 [Acts 1904, chap. 88.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$1,000.)

25 For the salary of the executive messenger, one
26 thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 4, sect. 6;
27 Acts 1902, chap. 523.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$1,000.)

28 For the salary of the assistant executive mes-
29 senger, eight hundred dollars. [Acts 1902,
30 chap. 523.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$800.)

31 For contingent expenses of the executive de-
32 partment, a sum not exceeding three thousand
33 dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 4, sect. 8.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$3,000.)

34 For postage, printing and stationery for the
35 executive department, a sum not exceeding eight
36 hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 6, sect. 25.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$800.)

37 For travelling and contingent expenses of the
38 governor and council, a sum not exceeding
39 twenty-five hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap.
40 6, sect. 25.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$2,500.)

41 For postage, printing and stationery for the
42 executive council, a sum not exceeding five hun-
43 dred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 6, sect. 25.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$500.)

44 For the payment of extraordinary expenses, to
45 be expended under the direction of the governor
46 and council, a sum not exceeding fifteen thousand
47 dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 4, sect. 9.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$15,000.)

48 For the preparation of tables and indexes relat-
49 ing to the statutes of the present and previous
50 years, a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars.
51 [Rev. Laws, chap. 9, sect. 1.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$500.)

52 For expenses incurred in the arrest of fugitives
53 from justice, a sum not exceeding one thousand
54 dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 217, sect. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$1,000.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
