## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Five.

### AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Salaries and Expenses of the State Board of Conciliation and Arbitration.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned  
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury  
3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,  
4 for the purposes specified for the year ending on  
5 the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hun-  
6 dred and five, to wit: —

7 For the salaries of the members of the state  
8 board of conciliation and arbitration, seventy-five  
9 hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 106; Acts  
10 1904, chap. 399.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$6,875.)

11 For the salary of the clerk of the state board  
12 of conciliation and arbitration, fifteen hundred  
13 dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 106; Acts 1904,  
14 chap. 399.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$1,375.)

15 For traveling, incidental and contingent ex-  
16 penses of the state board of conciliation and arbi-  
17 tration, the same to include printing and binding  
18 the annual report, also the compensation of expert  
19 assistants, a sum not exceeding eleven thousand  
20 six hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 106;  
21 Acts 1902, chap. 438.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$13,600.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
