AN ACT

Making Appropriations for printing and binding
Public Documents, for purchasing Paper and for
publishing Laws and Matters relating to Elections.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury
3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, for the year ending on
5 the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred
6 and five, to wit: —

7 For printing and binding the series of public
8 documents, a sum not exceeding eighteen thousand
9 dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 9 ; Acts 1902, chap.
10 438.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$16,000.)

11 For printing the pamphlet edition of the acts
12 and resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-
13 ceeding four thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
14 chap. 9.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$4,000.)

15 For printing and binding the "blue book"
16 edition of the acts and resolves of the present
17 year, a sum not exceeding seven thousand dollars.
18 [Rev. Laws, chap 9.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$7,000.)

19 For the newspaper publication of the general
20 laws and information intended for the public, a
21 sum not exceeding five hundred dollars. [Rev.
22 Laws, chap. 9.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$500.)

23 For reports of decisions of the supreme judicial
24 court, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.
25 [Rev. Laws, chap. 9.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$2,000.)

26 For the purchase of paper used in the execution
27 of the contract for the state printing, a sum not
28 exceeding thirty-six thousand dollars. [Rev.
29 Laws, chap. 5, sect. 3.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$32,000.)

30 For assessors' books and blanks, a sum not ex-
31 ceeding fifteen hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws,
32 chap. 12.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$2,000.)

33 For registration books and blanks, indexing
34 returns and editing registration report, a sum not
35 exceeding thirty-eight hundred dollars. [Rev.
36 Laws, chap. 11.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$3,800.)

37 For printing and distributing ballots, a sum
38 not exceeding ten thousand dollars. [Rev.
39 Laws, chap. 11.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$9,000.)

40 For blank forms for town officers, election laws
41 and blanks and instructions on all matters relat-
42 ing to elections, expense of advertising the state
43 ticket, a sum not exceeding four thousand dol-
44 lars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 11.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$4,000.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
