Bill accompanying the petition of George H. Jackson for legislation to provide that peaceful communications may be had with applicants for positions during strikes, lockouts and disputes. Labor. January 12.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Five.

AN ACT

To allow Peaceful Communications with Applicants for Positions during Strikes, Lockouts and Labor Disputes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. In case of a strike or lockout or other
2 dispute between an employer and his employees, it shall
3 be lawful for the employees, or for other persons, to
4 walk upon the public streets and ways in the vicinity of
5 the place of employment or in any other place to which
6 they have lawful access, and in a peaceful way to con-
7 verse with persons intending to go to such employer for
8 work, for the purpose of informing them of actual facts
9 in order to induce them not to enter into or not to con-
10 tinue in said employer's service.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
