AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in the Department of the Adjutant General and for Sundry Military Expenses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, for the year ending on
5 the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hun-
6 dred and five, to wit:—

7 For the salary of the adjutant general, thirty-
8 six hundred dollars. [Acts 1904, chap. 439.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$3,600.)

9 For the salaries of the six clerks in the adjutant
10 general's department, ninety-two hundred dollars.
11 [Acts 1904, chap. 439.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$8,700.)

12 For the salary of the messenger in the adjutant

13 general's department, eight hundred dollars.

14 [Acts 1904, chap. 439.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$800.)

15 For such additional clerical assistance as the
16 adjutant general may find necessary, and for the
17 compensation of employees at the state arsenal, a
18 sum not exceeding sixty-three hundred dollars.

19 [Acts 1904, chap. 439.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$6,800.)

20 For incidental and contingent expenses in the
21 adjutant general's department, a sum not exceed-
22 ing thirty-five hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws,
23 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$3,500.)

24 For printing and binding the annual report of
25 the adjutant general, a sum not exceeding one
26 thousand dollars. [Acts 1902, chap. 438.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$1,100.)

27 For compensation of officers and men of the
28 volunteer militia, a sum not exceeding one hun-
29 dred and sixty thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
30 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$165,000.)

31 For the transportation of officers and men of
32 the volunteer militia, when on military duty, a
33 sum not exceeding eighteen thousand dollars.
34 [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$19,000.)

35 For expenses in connection with the rifle prac-
36 tice of volunteer militia, a sum not exceeding
37 twenty-four thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap.
38 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$23,000.)

39 For an allowance to commissioned officers of
40 the militia towards the purchase of uniforms, a
41 sum not exceeding seventeen thousand dollars.
42 [Acts 1904, chap. 361.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$17,000.)

43 For allowance to officers of the militia for the
44 care and responsibility of property, a sum not
45 exceeding five thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
46 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$5,150.)

47 For allowance and repairs of clothing of the
48 volunteer militia, a sum not exceeding ninety-six
49 hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$9,000.)

50 For rent of brigade and battalion headquarters
51 and company armories, a sum not exceeding
52 twenty-eight thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
53 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$38,000.)

54 For heating, lighting, furnishing and caring
55 for the armories recently erected in certain cities
56 of the Commonwealth, for the use of the volunteer
57 militia, a sum not exceeding thirty-eight thousand
58 dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$35,000.)

59 For services of janitors of certain armories, a
60 sum not exceeding six thousand dollars. [Rev.
61 Laws, chap. 16, sect. 117.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$7,000.)

62 For quartermaster's supplies, a sum not ex-
63 ceeding eleven thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
64 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$10,000.)

65 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
66 quartermaster general's department, a sum not
67 exceeding six thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
68 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$5,000.)

69 For expenses in connection with military ac-
70 counts not otherwise provided for, a sum not
71 exceeding four thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,
72 chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$4,000.)

73 For grading and care of the camp ground and
74 buildings of the Commonwealth at Framingham,
75 a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.
76 [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$2,500.)

77 For furnishing, repair and care of the United
78 States steamer Inca, a sum not exceeding twelve
79 hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 16.]

(Appropriation 1904, \$1,200. Appropriation deficiency
1904, \$1,994.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon
2 its passage.
