## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Five.

### AN ACT

Relative to the Approval of Age and Schooling Certificates of Minors.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section thirty-one of chapter one  
2 hundred and six of the Revised Laws, as amended  
3 by chapter four hundred and thirty-two of the acts  
4 of the year nineteen hundred and four, is hereby  
5 amended by striking out all of said section and  
6 inserting in place thereof the following: —

7 *Section 31.* An age and schooling certificate  
8 shall not be approved unless satisfactory evidence  
9 is furnished by a certificate of birth or baptism of  
10 the minor that the minor is of the age stated in  
11 the certificate.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on the  
2 first day of July in the year nineteen hundred and  
3 five.
