The committee on Towns, to whom was referred the communication from the Board of Harbor and Land Commissioners, proposing, under authority of section 7 of chapter 25 of the Revised Laws, changes in the boundary lines between the city of Marlborough and the town of Berlin and between the towns of Boylston and West Boylston, Berlin and Clinton, Berlin and Hudson, Lynnfield and Reading and Hamilton and Wenham (House, No. 1148), report the accompanying bill.

AN ACT

To establish the Boundary Line between the Towns of
Boylston and West Boylston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The following described line shall here-
2 after be the boundary line between the towns of Boyl-
3 ston and West Boylston:— Beginning at the corner of
4 Boylston, Sterling and West Boylston, at a granite
5 monument in latitude forty-two degrees, twenty-three
6 minutes, twelve and eighty-four hundredths seconds and
7 longitude seventy-one degrees, forty-four minutes, thirty-
8 two and sixty-three hundredths seconds; thence south
9 sixty-seven degrees, eight minutes west (true bearing)
10 along the present dividing line between Boylston and
11 West Boylston, three thousand four hundred and eighty-
12 six feet to a granite monument standing five feet south-
13 east of a junction of walls in latitude forty-two degrees,
14 twenty-two minutes, fifty-nine and forty-five hundredths
15 seconds and longitude seventy-one degrees, forty-five
16 minutes, fifteen and forty-two hundredths seconds; thence

17 south nineteen degrees, twenty-seven minutes west (true
18 bearing) along the present dividing line between Boyl-
19 ston and West Boylston, four thousand seven hundred
20 and eighty-eight feet to a point a few feet north of the
21 northerly shore of the Nashua reservoir in latitude forty-
22 two degrees, twenty-two minutes, fourteen and eighty-
23 five hundredths seconds and longitude seventy-one
24 degrees, forty-five minutes, thirty-six and sixty-six hun-
25 dredths seconds; thence south six degrees, twenty-five
26 minutes west (true bearing) nine thousand seven hun-
27 dred and thirty-five feet, crossing the reservoir to a gran-
28 ite monument standing in the present dividing line
29 between Boylston and West Boylston in latitude forty-
30 two degrees, twenty minutes, thirty-nine and twenty-eight
31 hundredths seconds and longitude seventy-one degrees,
32 forty-five minutes, fifty-one and seventeen hundredths
33 seconds; thence south fifty-seven minutes west (true
34 bearing), eleven thousand four hundred and twenty-one
35 feet along the present dividing line between Boylston
36 and West Boylston, to a granite monument, standing at
37 the corner of Boylston, Shrewsbury and West Boylston,
38 in latitude forty-two degrees, eighteen minutes, forty-
39 six and forty-eight hundredths seconds and longitude
40 seventy-one degrees, forty-five minutes, fifty-three and
41 seventy hundredths seconds.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
