AN ACT

Relative to the Rank and Compensation of the District Police Officer detailed as Captain of the State Steamer.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The officer of the detective de-
2 partment of the district police who, from time to
3 time, shall be detailed to the command of the
4 Commonwealth's steamer "Lexington," or any
5 other vessel commissioned and used in place
6 thereof, shall have the rank of "captain" of said
7 police force; and, while engaged in such service,
8 shall be paid, in addition to his regular compensa-
9 tion as officer of such force, the sum of forty-five
10 dollars per month; but such additional compensa-
11 tion shall be so payable only between the first
12 day of April and the thirty-first day of October,
13 inclusive.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on the
2 first day of April in the year nineteen hundred
3 and five.
