## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

### AN ACT

To establish a Part of the Boundary Line between the Town of Belmont and the City of Cambridge.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The following described line shall here-  
2 after be in part the boundary line between the town of  
3 Belmont and the city of Cambridge, viz: Beginning at  
4 the intersection of the northeasterly line of Grove street  
5 extended with the southwesterly line of Huron avenue  
6 extended at a point in the present boundary line between  
7 said Belmont and Cambridge; thence northerly across  
8 said Huron avenue and along its northeasterly side to a  
9 point in the southerly side of Washington street ex-

10 tended; thence easterly and northerly along the south-  
11 erly and easterly side of said Huron avenue to its  
12 intersection with Concord avenue; thence across said  
13 Concord avenue and along the northeasterly side of  
14 Wellington street to a point near Wellington brook, in  
15 the present boundary line between Belmont and Cam-  
16 bridge, the same being shown upon a plan by F. H.  
17 Kendall, surveyor, dated November twenty, nineteen  
18 hundred and five, and on file in the town clerk's office of  
19 Belmont, and in the registry of deeds for the southern  
20 district of the county of Middlesex.

1 SECTION 2. The territory between the former bound-  
2 ary between said Belmont and Cambridge and the line  
3 hereby established shall be and remain public ways, and  
4 the said city of Cambridge shall have the right in com-  
5 mon with the town of Belmont, so far as may reasonably  
6 be necessary for the comfort, convenience or health of  
7 the inhabitants of the city of Cambridge, to lay and  
8 maintain sewer, drain and water pipes, in and along said  
9 ways and to grant permission to lay and maintain gas  
10 pipes therein and to place and maintain in said ways,  
11 poles and wires for electric lighting; but the ways shall  
12 be restored by the city of Cambridge, whenever disturbed  
13 by said city or those acting by its permission for any of  
14 the purposes aforesaid, to a condition as good as that in  
15 which it was before being so disturbed, as expeditiously  
16 as practicable and with as little disturbance as possible  
17 to public travel.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
