DEAR SIR: — On April 5, 1906, the House of Representatives passed the following order: —

“*Ordered*, That the Chief of the Bureau of Statistics of Labor be instructed to report forthwith to the General Court the number of legal voters in each of the newly made wards of the cities of Lowell and Worcester at the time of taking the recent decennial census.”

This order was adopted in concurrence by the Senate on April 5, 1906.

In accordance with the terms of the order I take pleasure in inclosing a statement showing the population and number of legal voters in each ward according to the new ward lines, on the basis of the Decennial Census of 1905.

The necessary information to prepare a similar table for the city of Lowell has not yet been received in this department.
