## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Six.

### AN ACT

To authorize Cities to pension Call Firemen or Substitute Call Firemen.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section eighty-one of chapter thirty-two  
2 of the Revised Laws is hereby amended by inserting  
3 after the word "fireman", in the tenth line, the words:  
4 — *call fireman or substitute call firemen*, — so as to read  
5 as follows: — *Section 81.* If a petition, signed by not  
6 less than two hundred registered voters of a city and re-  
7 questing that the question of the acceptance of the pro-  
8 visions of this section be submitted to the voters of such  
9 city at the next annual or special city election, is filed  
10 with the city clerk not less than thirty days before said  
11 election, said question shall be so submitted, and if it is  
12 accepted, the city council of such city may thereafter,  
13 under such restrictions and subject to such provisions as  
14 it may by vote or ordinance prescribe, pension any fire-  
15 man, who, by reason of permanent disability incurred  
16 while in the performance of his duty as fireman, *call*  
17 *fireman, or substitute call firemen*, is no longer able to  
18 perform active service as a fireman.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-  
2 sage.
