AN ACT

To extend the Time within which the City of Cambridge is Authorized to accept the Act relative to Tunnels or Conduits under and through Broad Canal.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The time within which the city council of
2 the city of Cambridge is authorized to accept chapter one
3 hundred and thirty of the acts of the year nineteen hun-
4 dred and six, providing that the city of Cambridge may
5 construct, operate, maintain and lease tunnels or con-
6 duits under and through Broad canal in the said city, is
7 hereby extended to five months from the date of the
8 passage of the said chapter.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
