AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in the Department of the Treasurer and Receiver General.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are
2 appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, for the fiscal year ending
5 on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred
6 and seven, to wit:—

7 For the salary of the treasurer and receiver gen-
8 eral of the Commonwealth, five thousand dollars.

10 For the salary of the first clerk in the treasurer's,
11 department, twenty-six hundred dollars. [Rev.

13 For the salary of the second clerk in the treas-
14 urer's department, twenty-one hundred dollars.

17 department, eighteen hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws,

52 despatch of public business, a sum not exceeding

55 For incidental and contingent expenses in the
56 treasurer's department, a sum not exceeding four
57 thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 6; Acts 1905,

59 For the salary of the legacy tax clerk in the treas-
60 urer's department, nineteen hundred dollars. [Rev.

62 For such expenses as the treasurer and receiver
63 general may find necessary in carrying out the pro-
64 visions of the act imposing a tax on collateral lega-
65 cies and successions, a sum not exceeding four thou-

68 For the salary of the deputy sealer of weights,
69 measures and balances, fifteen hundred dollars.

72 For traveling and other expenses of the deputy
73 sealer of weights, measures and balances, a sum not
74 exceeding seven hundred dollars; and for furnishing
75 sets of standard weights, measures and balances to
76 towns not heretofore provided therewith, and to
77 each newly incorporated town; also to provide cities
78 and towns with such parts of said sets as may be
79 necessary to make their sets complete, a sum not
80 exceeding four hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
