RESOLVE

Relative to the Jamestown Ter-Centennial Exposition.

1 *Resolved*, That for the purpose of providing at the
2 Jamestown ter-centennial exposition, to be held on the
3 shores and waters of Hampton Roads in the state of Vir-
4 ginia, in the year nineteen hundred and seven, a suit-
5 able representation of the resources, products and progress
6 of the Commonwealth, a board of Jamestown exposition
7 managers for Massachusetts, consisting of five residents
8 of the Commonwealth, shall be appointed by the governor,
9 with the advice and consent of the council. They shall
10 have charge of the interests of the Commonwealth and
11 of its citizens in the preparation and exhibition at said
12 exposition of the natural and industrial products of the
13 Commonwealth and of objects illustrating its history,
14 progress and moral and material welfare and develop-

15 ment. They shall communicate with the officers of the
16 exposition and they shall obtain and shall disseminate
17 throughout the Commonwealth all necessary information
18 regarding it, and in general shall have and exercise full
19 authority in relation to the participation of the Common-
20 wealth and its citizens in the exposition. There shall be
21 placed at the disposal of the governor and council a sum
22 not exceeding ten thousand dollars, to be expended by
23 them in such manner as they shall deem for the best in-
24 terests of the Commonwealth, to be in addition to the
25 amount provided by chapter sixty-five of the resolves of
26 the year nineteen hundred and six.
