## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seven.

### AN ACT

Relative to the Pensioning of Employees of the City of  
Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The mayor and aldermen of the city of  
2 Boston, if by vote of its city council it accepts the pro-  
3 visions of this and the following section, may retire from  
4 active service and place upon a pension roll any employee  
5 of such city sixty-five years of age or over who has per-  
6 formed faithful service in any department for said city  
7 for not less than twenty consecutive years, or any em-  
8 ployee of such city whom the city physician certifies in  
9 writing to be permanently disabled, mentally or physi-  
10 cally, by injuries sustained through no fault of his in the

11 actual performance of duty, from further performing  
12 duty as such employee.

1 SECTION 2. The amount of the annual pension al-  
2 lowed to any person under the provisions of the pre-  
3 ceding section shall not exceed one-half of the annual  
4 compensation received by him at the time of such retire-  
5 ment. Such pensions shall be paid by the city, which  
6 may appropriate money therefor.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its pas-  
2 sage.
